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Examine the rhetoric of the text and analyze your intellectual and emotional response to the rhetoric and how it affects you. Is the author dry and factual, or hyperbolic? If they cite acts, are the facts skewed, exaggerated, altered, or actual? Are there discrepancies or logwhistles? Is their language clear or is it convoluted? What are some shifts you noticed by your perception or opinion of the text during your examination?)
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6] Read with skepticism to formulate questions around the reading, as opposed to taking it at face value. What questions have you identified after reading it this way?
7] Read again to identify any answers to your questions. Were you able to find any? Does the author have evidence to substantiate their claims?

8] How did the author's rhetoric and aesthetic or tone impact your ability to discern the author's influence versus your own thoughts and ideas? Were you easily persuaded, or
were you able to maintain objectivity?
9] Were there instances in which you generally agreed or disagreed with the author, but found at times that you either disagreed or agreed with them? Was it a partial agreement/disagreement, or full agreement/disagreement? How did this complicate your response to the reading?
